

- For the safety of our students, unauthorized vehicles are not allowed into the school compound.
- You are strongly encouraged to park your vehicles at the multistorey carpark directly opposite or next to the school. You could walk across to the school building using the pedestrian crossing when you fetch your child/ward home after dismissal.
- Remind your child/ward to cross safely using the traffic lights/zebra crossing.



- In the event of a rainy weather, parents/guardians can drive into the school compound to drop the child/ward off at the sheltered school foyer.
- Please ensure that your child/ward has his/her school bag with him/her and is ready to alight in the shortest time possible.
- Parents/guardians should refrain from alighting from your vehicles to hug or bid goodbye to your children or to take bags out from the car boot.



- Please note that on rainy days, a massive traffic jam may occur outside and within the school's premises at peak hours. When you drive out of the school premises, kindly make a left turn only at the exit gate to facilitate a smooth flow of traffic during heavy traffic conditions.
- Your cooperation is much appreciated to facilitate the smooth and safe arrival of all students to school during the busy hours in the morning. Please be safe and considerate to other road users.

SCHOOL HOURS

- The first school bell rings at 7.30 a.m. to signal the start of the school day.
- For Primary 1 students, do arrive in school on time by 7.25 a.m. and get ready for your first period to start the day's learning.
- Reporting time for Monday and Thursday is at 8.20 a.m. as the first period starts at 8.30 a.m.
- Students arriving after 7.25 a.m. (Tue, Wed & Fri) & 8.20 a.m. (Mon & Thurs) will be recorded as late-comers.

DURING SCHOOL What does my first day of school look like?

- The first day of school for 2026 will be Friday, 2 January 2026.
- There will be orientation (including recess) activities for P1 students on that day. The P1 orientation programme will be carried out from 8 a.m. to 10.30 a.m.
- More than 1 teacher will be assigned to each P1 class to ensure that all P1 students are cared for. The teachers will also help to orientate the P1 students to their new surrounding.

DURING SCHOOL What does my first day of school look like?

- In view of the limited seating capacity, we would like to request that at most 2 parents accompany each child into the school compound on the first day of school, 2 January 2026, Friday.
- Teachers will be ready to receive the P1 students and parents at the arrival gate C and direct them to their classrooms.
- Parents/Guardians will be directed to the school hall after sending their children to the classrooms. The School Leaders and Year Head for Primary 1 will be conducting a Parents' Talk in the hall at 8 a.m.

DURING SCHOOL What time is recess?

- All P1 students will have their recess from 9.30 a.m. to 10.15 a.m. (extra 15 mins for the first 2 days, 5 & 6 January 2026).
- Do not worry. Your caring Form Teachers will be there to guide you and ensure your safety during recess. The friendly aunties and uncles at the different food stalls will also help you.

DURING SCHOOL Where do I go when the dismissal bell rings?

- Dismissal time can be quite confusing for any student who is new to the school.
- Talk to your parents/ guardians about where to go during dismissal.
- Do not change the dismissal venue without informing your Form Teachers.
- If you are unsure what to do and where to go, talk to your
 Form Teachers and ask for help.

Gate F is gate that is located nearer to the bus stop.

- Be familiar with how you are going home from school.
- Write down your dismissal arrangement on your name tag and GEMbeats (Student handbook) so that your teachers can refer to it.
- At dismissal, your last period teacher will bring you to your dismissal point.

Taking school Bus

- Assemble at the Music playground.
- Teachers will lead the P1 students to the music playground and hand them over to the bus drivers.

Attending Student Care Centre (SCC)

- Assemble at the Arts Gallery.
- SCC teachers will fetch the P1 students from the Arts Gallery and usher them to SCC.

Going home with older siblings studying in NSPS

- Assemble at the respective Gates B, C & F or canteen.
- Older siblings will fetch them from the respective school gates or canteen and go home together.

To be fetched by parents/ guardians

- Assemble at respective Gates B, C & F.
- Parents to inform your child/ward the specific gate that he/she will be fetched.
- Teachers will accompany the P1 students to the respective gates for dismissal.

*Should your parents/guardian be late, please go to the Security Post and make a call.



WHAT TO DO IF I AM UNWELL AND CANNOT ATTEND SCHOOL?

- If you are unwell and cannot attend school, your parents/ guardian will have to inform your Form Teachers via Class Dojo.
- Parents will also need to submit your medical certificate (MC) via parents gateway.



WHAT TO DO IF I AM UNWELL DURING LESSONS?

- If you feel unwell during lessons, please let your class teacher know immediately. Your teacher will advise you on what to do next.
- You will need to be fetched home from school by your parents/guardians or an authorised adult. Your parents/ guardian needs to fill up a form before leaving the school compound with



WHAT TO DO IF I HAVE FORGOTTEN TO BRING MY HOMEWORK/ POCKET MONEY/ LEARNING MATERIALS TO SCHOOL?

 If you have forgotten to bring an item that you need to submit or use in school, stay calm and inform your teachers in class.
 Your teacher will guide you on the next step to take.

Notes to Parents/ Guardians

- We seek your cooperation in refraining from bringing money, water bottles, PE attire or books which your child/ward has forgotten to bring to school.
- We would like to instil RESPONSIBILITY in each NSPS student, not through punishment but by devising ways with the child to help him/her remember.
- We will ensure that your child/ward gets to eat even if he/she forgets to bring pocket money to school and for all the above, we will use our GEMbeats as a tool of communication with you.
